The space race sidetracked Dale, when he envisioned himself designing rocket engines. After selling the family farm in 1963, he sensed a great loss, so he switched to studying agronomy. A mistake, as in 1966 he rediscovered horticulture and landscape design by being enthralled by a single beautiful small garden. He studied the two fields on his own and for two years worked for a landscape firm. Another detour took him to agricultural economics, then, economics, in which he earned M.S. degrees. He taught economics at Milwaukee Area Technical College from 1970 until 1999, simultaneously operating a part-time nursery and contracting firm

He began building his gardens after buying a bare, one-acre lot near Waukesha, WI in 1969. Every year witnessed new gardens and features, and the end does not appear in sight.

The most significant change occurred in 2005 when he started a Japanese-style garden. He visited Foxfire Gardens, a Japanese-style garden, near Marshfield, WI, where he was stunned by the beauty of owner Steve Schulte's small moss garden. It was the most important garden he ever visited. He grows over 50 species of moss, usually on the ground, but also in over 300 containers and on over 600 rocks. Recently, his gardens appeared in books and magazines, and he now give lectures on moss gardening.

A passionate moss gardener, Dale Sievert's garden has been featured in a wide array of books and magazines, and he has written articles on moss for several national magazines. In this special afternoon discussion, Dale will highlight some of the many moss varieties he grows, as well as the culture of moss, showing how he uses them on the ground, on rocks, and in containers.

If you are interested in gardening or bonsai this speaker will interest you. He will have a great PowerPoint presentation and give us some advice on how to choose and grow mosses. He suggests that anyone interested in growing moss get the book by Annie Martin called <u>Magical World of Moss</u> <u>Gardening</u> by timber press. The club is purchasing a few copies of the book for us to read and share.

2017 Intermediate Classes



MBS will again sponsor an Intermediate Class in 2017. It is recommended for those members who find that they are committed to furthering their understanding and enjoyment of the art of Bonsai. It is designed to deepen the principles that you have learned in the Novice Class by incorporating teaching methods such as lecture, discussion, demonstration, review, repetition, critique, and hands on work with your own trees and each other's. Many members find that they enroll in this class more than once.

The Intermediate Class will be led by Steve Ca, and take place in his home studio. Each of the six sessions will center around one of the three important seasons of bonsai work: Spring repotting, Summer tree/branch development, and Fall assessment, cut back, and preparation for next year's growth expectations. Each class will be specific to the season, and all will include an understanding of why we do certain things at this time, horticultural principles, and most importantly, DESIGN. We have added an extra class this year so that you have adequate time to focus on display and wiring. As a course requirement, you will have the opportunity to stretch your new understanding of bonsai principles by providing teaching assistance at the club's Beginner Workshop, to be held at BBG on September 9, 2017, from 9-12. Under the supervision of experienced club members, you will be challenged to share what you have learned with new bonsai hobbyists.

The Intermediate Class is limited to six students. Each member is required to bring their own trees, tools, wire, pots, soil and lots of questions to each class. Soil for one tree reporting will be included in the class fee. After completing this class, you will be better prepared and encouraged to participate in special club workshops with visiting guest artists, not to mention you will grow in your enjoyment of Bonsai!
