First I got some larch and hemlocks from the Tomahawk area. After that it was game on! Juniper from South Dakota, many elms and other trees from the Mayor of Blueberryville, a 4 foot tall burning bush from my brother's neighbor's yard. (Yes, he knew about it) Then, a yew from my neighbor's house. (He knows too) An apple from a wilderness nearby and most recently 2 junipers from Kansas.

What I like about it is that is the closest one can get to making a bonsai all by yourself, unless you are crazy enough to grow trees from seed. That would be really bonkers.

Most of my trees are not "finished" bonsais. Are they ever finished? But they are making progress. And I love them.
