The registration window has opened for the 2020 Novice Class, There will be <u>ONLY</u> 12 openings for this class so if you are interested do not delay, as it will fill up quickly

What does this class provide?

The Novice Class curriculum is focused on helping you develop and prepare a solid foundation of basic bonsai skills and knowledge.

Sessions 1 thru 3 are mainly lecture based with demonstrations to help you better understand the ins and outs of bonsai cultivation.

We will have discussions about watering; soil compositions; fertilization; pest management; repotting; design; pruning; wiring; seasonal timing of work, and much more.

This class provides a work book for future reference and you will also leave with a new tree for your collection.

In the 4th session you will be working on the tree provided, styling and reporting

The 5th session you will bring your tree back, we will review its current state and provide suggestions as to what you should be doing in the future with this tree.

We will also visit a local nursery and discuss how to evaluate "potential bonsai" from typically available nursery stock.
