## Thinking about Repotting Ron F.

-Are you prepared to repot?

We often think of repotting as a task that needs to be done in spring, but are you truly prepared to take on this task? My goal of this presentation is to get you thinking of all the scenarios that you may encounter during your repot and have you considering all the variables and items you would want to have ready for use if needed. Repotting is like open heart surgery for a human, so you need to be equipped to react effectively and efficiently. Can you imagine what it would be like if your surgeon suddenly needed a specific instrument and it was at the other end of the hospital? Your repotting session should not be treated any differently.

Like a good Boy Scout "Be Prepared", this will highly increase you chance of a successful and less stressful repotting session.

-What do you think about this pot?

The second part of my presentation will look at "POTS", what considerations should you be thinking about when you are looking for a pot for your tree. There are many variables that should be part of your decision making beyond Glazed or Unglazed, Pot shape and size. We will go through the many aspects that make up a pot and why you should be thinking about how they may affect what will look OK, and what will make a much better selection to showcase your tree.

I hope both of these subjects are going to get your thoughts going into the 2022 potting season that will be on us sooner than you think
