

What is Bonsai?



The word Bonsai (bone-sigh) is derived from two Japanese characters or word phrases, *bon* and *sai*. The “*bon*” is the pot, tray or container, and the ‘*sai*’ is the tree, shrub or planting.

You don't have to be an expert to experience the adventure of bonsai!

About Bonsai

Bonsai began in China and migrated to Japan (where we most associate bonsai). Bonsai combines the sciences of botany and horticulture with the art of design and personal interpretation.

Bonsai is creating living trees and landscapes in miniature. It is not a special dwarf plant, but rather a way of growing, shaping and displaying any kind of woody tree or shrub as a living work of art.

In this art, the appearance or age is desirable. The scars of aging tell story of the tree's life and are the source of its character.

Thousands of people all over the world have come to enjoy this miniature expression of nature. Each country and climate has brought it's own subtle changes in style, plant variety, methodology, and horticultural practices.
